Successful Aging: Overcoming the Hurdles

This two-day institute provides health care practitioners and faculty with information concerning various critical issues related to the elderly. There will be sessions of interest for all health care professionals who work with behavioral health, health promotion, end-of-life issues and a wide variety of topics related to aging issues nationally as well as locally. Emphasis is placed on practical information that can be used to enhance the overall health and well being of our older population. Psychosocial as well as physical aspects of healthy aging will be discussed. Presenters include experts from a variety of disciplines, as well as providers in the field who work directly with older individuals. These presenters are equipped with knowledge of current initiatives and controversies that arise in aging.

Who Should Attend?

The SGI should be attended by all faculty in health care education programs, as well as practitioners who are involved in direct services to the elderly, students in the health professions and mental health workers. These include physicians, nurses, dentists, physician assistants, occupational and physical therapists, speech/hearing specialists, social workers, gerontologists, counselors, dietitians, recreational therapists, health promotion activities directors, Area Agencies on Aging, and institution or agency administrators and professional staff.

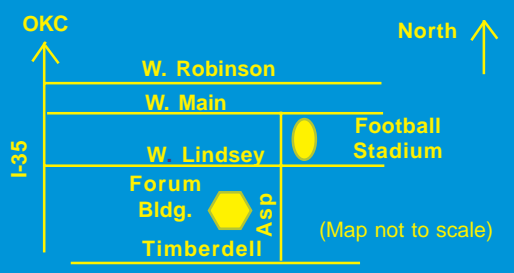
