The University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center Police Department ("OUHSC PD"), provides police and fire protection for the safety of life and property on campus. The department consists of 61 employees. OUHSC police officers are governed by the same powers as sheriffs and municipal police officers. They have the same authority to enforce state laws, including making arrests when appropriate. In addition to providing police services for the University, police officers are assigned to hospitals and other entities within the campus jurisdiction. The OUHSC Site Support Department (405-271-2121) is responsible for day-to-day maintenance and repair of all campus facilities including student housing and for issuing keys. Keys may not be duplicated outside the University. Because certain University agencies including, but not limited to, Site Support and the OUHSC PD, must have immediate access to all spaces, as in the event of an emergency, only locks and keys authorized by OUHSC Site Support are to be used on University property. The OUHSC Police Communications Specialist monitors various campus sites by card access and CCTV cameras. The Communications Specialists are in constant contact with other police and criminal justice agencies throughout the United States via a national Teletype system. Numerous Police and security agencies are located next to the OUHSC campus, including Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation Security, Veteran's Administration Medical Center Police and the Oklahoma Highway Patrol Troop R. OUHSC Police personnel work closely with each of the above listed agencies, as well as the Oklahoma City Police Department and the Oklahoma County Sheriff's Office regarding crimes that occur in the area of the campus that may have an impact on the safety of the campus community. The Department is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week for your protection, responding to all police, fire, environmental and medical emergencies.

If you are a victim or a witness to a crime, contact OUHSC Police immediately at 271-4911. A police officer will meet with you to gather pertinent information to complete an official report. If you have any concerns of a possible threat, these concerns can be reported confidentially by email to concern@ouhsc.edu. All reported crimes are investigated immediately. Additional security methods are implemented to apprehend offenders when appropriate. The OUHSC Police will issue timely warnings via e-mail or through the ECS – Emergency Communication System to ensure prompt notification to the campus community on crimes that represent a continuing threat. Crimes occurring in jurisdictional areas near campus are monitored and reported to the campus community when appropriate. A daily crime log is available upon request, recording all crimes reported to the OUHSC PD, including the nature, date, time, general location of each crime; and the disposition of the complaint, if known. The OUHSC Police Department provides educational programs to enhance awareness and prevention of sexual offenses on campus. These programs include Safety Awareness Seminars and Basic Self-Protection for Women, courses are available upon request. Immediate reporting of rape, acquaintance rape and other sexual offenses (forcible or non-forcible) to the OUHSC Police at 271-4911 is essential. Prompt reporting will ensure the preservation of vital evidence. The department provides law enforcement and investigative services as needed by the victim. OUHSC Police personnel will assist in contacting counselors and medical professionals for victims and witnesses. Changes in academic arrangements will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis, as requested, and will be accommodated when reasonably available. The University does provide student housing on campus; therefore, changes in living arrangements can be coordinated through the University. Student groups or their sponsors are encouraged to coordinate with OUHSC Police for all off-campus student functions. OUHSC does not have student organizations with off-campus housing facilities. For any off-campus student functions, resulting in criminal activity, OUHSC PD would assist the investigating law enforcement agency.

Procedures for campus disciplinary actions in cases of an alleged sex offense, where both the accuser and the accused are affiliated with the University, provide both parties the same opportunities to have others present during a disciplinary proceeding. Both the accuser and the accused will be advised of the outcome of disciplinary hearings. University sanctions up to and including termination or expulsion, will be implemented following a final determination of the disciplinary hearing.

The University of Oklahoma recognizes its responsibility as an educational and public service institution and promotes a healthy and productive environment. University policy prohibits illegal use of drugs or alcohol in the workplace, on University property, or as part of any University sponsored activity. All applicable laws pertaining to drugs and alcohol are strictly enforced. The OUHSC PD participates each October in "Alcohol and Drug Awareness Week" and offers programs that can be tailored to particular groups. The Criminal Incident chart below reflects actual crimes reported to the OUHSC Police Department. None of the offenses displayed evidence that the victim was intentionally selected because of the actual or perceived race, gender, religion, sexual orientation or ethnicity or disability of the victim. Campus crime statistics are reported each month to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation. The OSBI collects crime data throughout the state and forwards information to the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The FBI publishes an annual "Crime in the United States" report that includes campus crime statistics from across the nation. building or property that is within or reasonably contiguous to the area previously identified in this definition, that is owned by the University but controlled by another person, is frequently used by students, and supports institutional purposes. *Residence-offenses occurring at the University Village Apartments

**Non-Campus—Includes any building or property owned or controlled by student organizations recognized by the school; and any building or property (other than a branch campus) owned or controlled by the school, that is used in direct support of, or in relation to, the school's educational purposes, is used by students, and that is not within the same reasonably contiguous area of the school.

***Public Property—All public property that is within the same reasonably contiguous geographic area of the school; such as a sidewalk, a street, other thoroughfare, or parking facility, and is adjacent to a facility owned or controlled by the school if the facility is used by the school in direct support of, or in a manner related to the University's educational purpose, i.e. The following is a list of public properties that are monitored by the OUHSC Police Department: OUMC Children's Hospital, Dean McGee Eye Institute, Department of Commerce, Easter Seals, Oklahoma City Clinic, Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation, Oklahoma School of Science and Mathematics, Oklahoma State Health Department, OU Children's Physicians Clinic, OU Physicians Clinic, Presbyterian Professional Building, Presbyterian Tower, Research Park 1-6, including city streets, parking lots, garages and easements.

The proper attitude and actions can help protect you, your belongings, fellow students and the campus community. The following tips are a few common sense safety precautions:

- There is safety in numbers—when leaving a building, walk in-groups or at least in pairs or call OUHSC Police for a security escort, 24 hours a day.
- Stay in well lit, well traveled areas when possible.
- Have your keys ready before you reach your location.
- For your safety, keep doors locked.
- If you work late or on weekends, notify OUHSC Police and an Officer will check on you.
- IMMEDIATELY report all suspicious people, vehicles or activities, regardless of how seemingly insignificant.
- Use common sense precautions—walk with confidence and assertiveness, don't be afraid to make a scene and obey your natural instincts.

If you are attacked:

- Remember, every situation is different—only you can decide which course of action is appropriate.
- Be realistic about your ability to defend yourself. Don't try to defeat your attacker, just get away as fast as you can.
- Weapons (guns, knives, mace, etc.) can easily be turned against you if you are not thoroughly trained in their use.
- Knowing simple self defense techniques can help overcome fear and develop confidence. Learn simple methods of self-protection that do not require much training or strength.

The University has implemented various safety measures in a continuing effort to further decrease criminal incidents and personal property loss.

- Student Orientation
- Gang Awareness
- TARC - Threat Assessment Review Committee will review reported threats of possible violence on campus
