Dewayne Andrews, M.D., is Vice President for Health Affairs and Executive Dean of the College of Medicine, a position he has held since 2002. He is a David Ross Boyd Professor of Medicine and also holds the Lawrence N. Upjohn Chair in Medicine. Dr. Andrews has overall responsibility for the medical education, biomedical research and clinical practice enterprises of the College of Medicine, including OU Physicians. He has oversight of both the Oklahoma City and Tulsa campuses of the College of Medicine.

Dr. Andrews received a B.S. degree from Baylor University and earned his M.D. from the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine. His residency and fellowship training in Internal Medicine and Nephrology were at the Johns Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore, Maryland and the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center. He served for two years as an Epidemic Intelligence Service Officer with the Centers for Disease Control of the U.S. Public Health Service.

Dr. Andrews' past research interests include hypertension, kidney disease, hepatorenal syndrome, and career choice decision factors in medical students. He has received several awards for excellence in teaching medicine. He has been a member of the Board of Governors of the American College of Physicians. In 2004, in recognition of outstanding contributions throughout his career, Dr. Andrews was awarded the high honor of designation as a "Master" of the American College of Physicians. He is a past chairman of the American Medical Association's Section on Medical Schools Governing Council. Dr. Andrews is a member of the Liaison Committee on Medical Education which is the national accrediting body for U.S. and Canadian medical schools. Dr. Andrews has served on the Board of Directors of the Oklahoma City Philharmonic Foundation, the Lyric Theater, and other civic organizations.
