D2L'S VIDEO ASSIGNMENT LEARNING TOOL

- Integrated assignment tool available by request from Academic Technology
- Allows student to record and submit video assignments directly in D2L through their YouSeeU integration
- 3. Allows for instructor feedback & peer feedback
- 4. Assignments connect as gradebook item for ease of assessment

VIDEO ASSIGNMENT FEATURES

▶ Asynchronous

► Students record assignments anytime, anywhere

▶ Customizable

Create assignments aligned to learning objectives

► Time-Stamped Feedback

Time-stamped feedback creates teachable moments and coaching opportunities

▶ Ability for Peer Review

► Engage learners and peers using peer feedback techniques

► Integration with D2L Gradebook

Automatically create grade item in gradebook to assign percentage grade

▶ Rubrics

Create custom rubrics to assess and grade

BENEFITS OF CLASSROOM USE

- User-friendly technology
 - ► Faculty ease of set-up
 - ▶ Students able to record compressed videos and save within D2L
- ► Ease of communication between instructor and students
 - Text and video feedback to student
 - ► Allow peer review/feedback of video assignments
- Online environment allows for
 - More instructor/student interaction
 - ► Time stamped feedback at the moment of demonstration
 - ▶ More time to process content, reflect and respond

CLASSROOM APPLICATION

Potential assignment types

- ► Individual student presentations
- Group project presentations
- Demo patient exam techniques
- Demo patient interview techniques
- Demo health education teaching in community setting
- ► Share reflective feedback

LIVED EXPERIENCE

- ▶ Providing "how to" instructions for doing video assignments
 - ► Computer requirements
 - ► Camera requirements
 - Making and saving guidelines
 - ► Uploading video to D2L
- Students able to record/submit practice video prior to final graded video
- ► Time stamped feedback
 - More accurate evaluation at moment of demonstration
 - Students can review feedback multiple times for improvement
 - More time to process content, reflect and respond

WHAT NEEDS IMPROVEMENT

- ▶ "How to" instructions
 - ► Expand and clarify details for fall semester based on what was learned
- Videos recorded on smart phones and uploaded to D2L
 - ► Large files difficult to upload, especially with some internet connections (esp. rural)
 - Video quality issues
 - ► Encourage recording in D2L
 - Creates compressed video files
 - Negates need to save and upload videos from another location
 - ► Better video/audio quality
 - ▶ Student can easily review, delete and redo video prior to final submission

WHAT NEEDS IMPROVEMENT


- ▶ Outcome Expectations
 - Provide clearer documentation of expectations for practice videos and final graded video assignment
 - ► Create instructor demonstration video to model what is expected in video outcomes

TAKE AWAYS

- ► Will use again in Fall 2018
 - Conquer your fear! Don't be afraid to use the technology!
 - ► Easy to use, especially if everything is recorded within D2L
 - ► Great use of D2L tools, especially for evaluation of distant learners' skill mastery
 - Multiple ways to use in the classroom
 - ▶ Patient exam skills
 - ▶ Communication skills
 - ▶ Team collaboration skills
