Dr. Chelle' Guttery has been with the University of Oklahoma Disability Resource Center since 2012. Her responsibilities include disability compliance oversight for employees and students with disabilities for OU's Norman, HSC and Tulsa campuses. She also consults with OU Legal Counsel on disability compliance issues for Rogers State University and Cameron University.

Dr. Guttery is responsible for staff and faculty development on best practices for accommodating students and employees with disabilities. She serves on a number of university committees including the Provost's Advisory Committee on Classroom Renovation, and the Honorable Robert Dole Scholarship Committee.

Prior to her role as Director of the Disability Resource Center, Dr. Guttery worked as a psychologist, specializing in providing developmental, cognitive, and psychological assessments as well as treatment to chronically and severely mentally ill children and adults. She received her Bachelors and Master's degrees in Counseling Psychology from the University of Central Oklahoma and her Ph.D. in Counseling Psychology from the University of Oklahoma.
